CHIEF COMPLAINT: Left arm injury.

HPI: Ayla is a healthy 19 month old girl who was injured three days ago. Her father was holding her, stumbled, and landed on her arm. She was seen at the hospital in Waterville and is referred down here today for follow-up.

PAST MEDICAL HISTORY: Her health otherwise is benign. She has no history of previous fractures.

MEDICATIONS: She is on no chronic medications.

OBJECTIVE: On physical exam she is healthy appearing in general. She is actually quite comfortable. The left arm is symmetrically swollen and she has ecchymosis in the cubital fossa, distally she has intact motor and sensory function. The hand is well perfused.

X-RAYS: X-rays taken today AP and lateral of the humerus demonstrate a fracture of the distal humerus above the supracondylar region. It is translated a little bit ulnarly. There is a little bit of dorsal translation but not much angulation.

She is placed in a splint in flexion and this did not change things very much.

ASSESSMENT/PLAN: She has a fracture that is a little bit displaced but I think at the age of 19 months the likelihood of her remodeling this completely is very good and I am not recommending surgery at this time. I am going to have her come back for an x-ray in a week to make sure things are not changing. Hopefully we won't have to do anything different but possibly change the splint to get more flexion but right now I think we are looking good with non operative treatment.
